The medal rush was led by Renee Lewis, who won gold in the peewee girls 50-metre and 200-metre sprints.

Janae Brissett took home silver in those races.

Meanwhile, Marcus Lewis won a bronze medal in the tyke boys 50-metre race and a pair of silvers in the 50-metre hurdles and long jump.

Habiba Imana took home silver medals in the tyke girls 50-metre and 200-metre races while Dante Williams won bronze in the peewee boys 200-metre dash and silver in the 50-metre event.

Dashawn Williams won gold in the tyke boys 400-metre race.

Jannoy Thomas was a gold medalist in the mite boys 50-metre hurdles.

Gisele Hinds took bronze in the tyke girls 50-metre sprint.

Caleb Thomas won gold in the senior boys shot put.

Finally, the tyke boys 4x200 relay team consisting of Lewis, Nathaniel Brown, Dashawn Williams and Onyi Ukaobasi captured gold.

The club was represented by 23 athletes aged 5-14.
